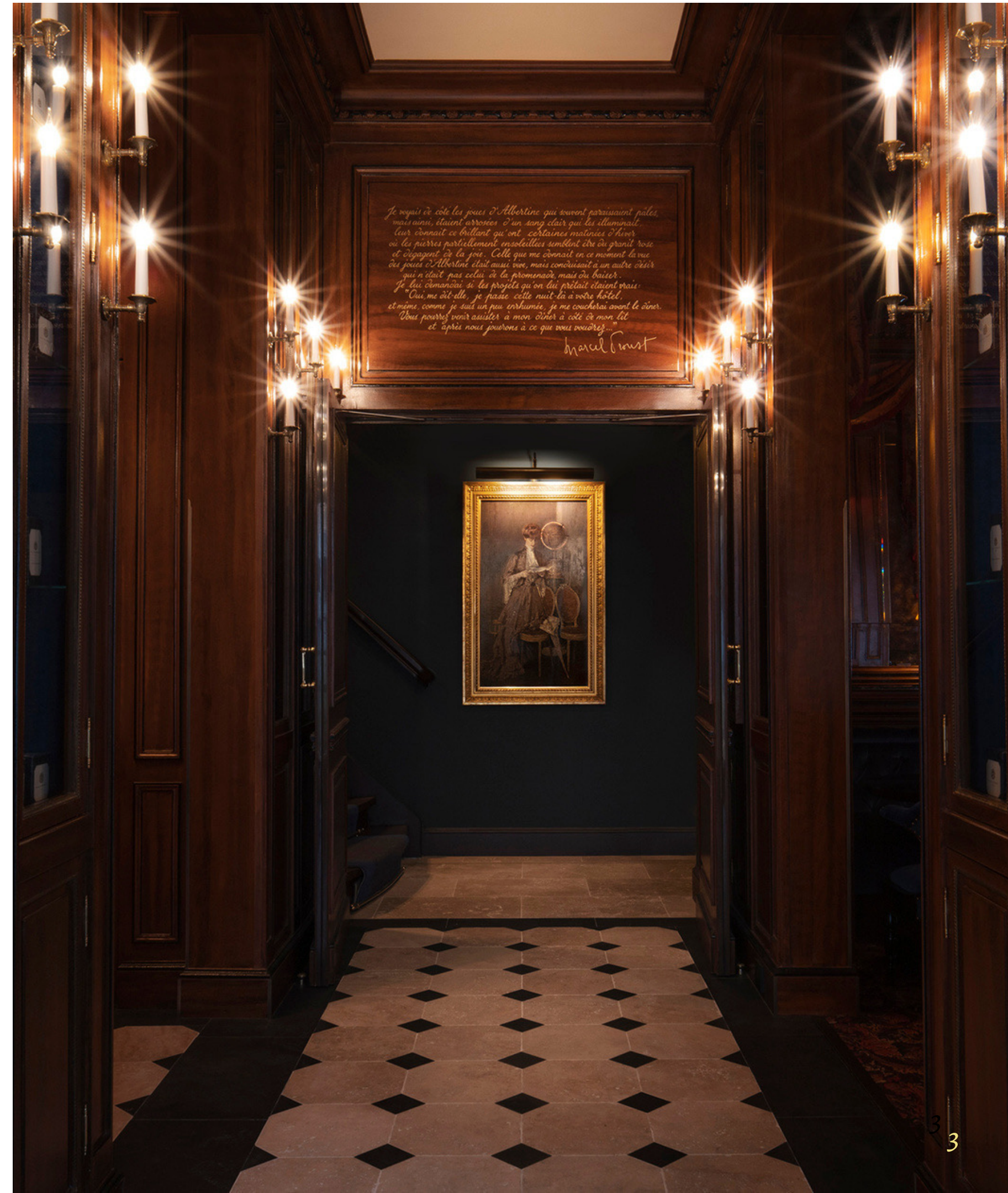


• MAISON PROUST •

The Maisons Particulières Collection comprises hotels designed as elegant private mansions. Confident and intimate, they reflect the spirit and soul of Paris. Preferring refined luxury to ostentation, the houses invite you to experience an extraordinary home, surrounded by the benevolent presence of a service that combines discretion and discernment. Maison Proust is part of the Maisons Particulières Collection.

Maison Proust takes up all the codes that have made Maison Souquet such a success, this time choosing to pay homage to Marcel Proust.

A decorator of genius, Jacques Garcia designed the Maison Proust. Considered one of the greatest writers of the 20th century, subsequent generations placed the author on a pedestal, making him a veritable literary myth. His masterpiece, *À la recherche du temps perdu*, is set in the Parisian salons of the Belle Époque, a cherished period when Paris reigned as an aesthetic and cultural master.





• MAISON PROUST •

La Maison Proust recreates the splendor of these Parisian salons, frequented in turn by queens and kings, princesses and princes, emperors, the aristocracy of the Faubourg Saint-Germain, and celebrities from the worlds of art and politics.

The Maison Proust features twenty-three rooms and suites, lounges (bar, library and winter garden) and a spa.

After opening its doors on November 18, 2022, to mark the centenary of Marcel Proust's death, Maison Proust was recognized as an exceptional establishment and named one of the winners of Condé Nast Traveller's Hot List 2023, a list highlighting recent venues that are raising the standards of hospitality through their unique style, ethos and quality service.

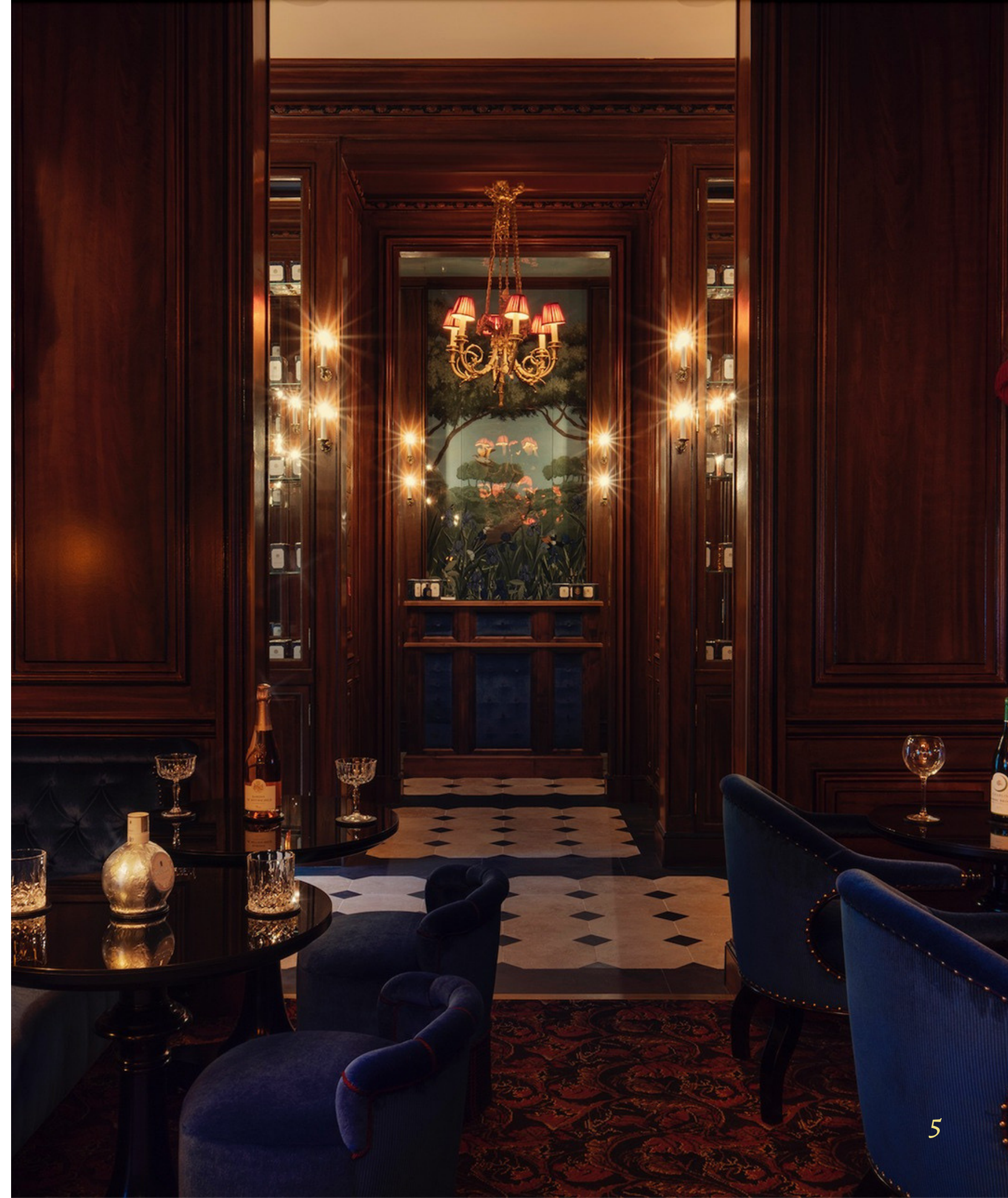

Punctuated by colonnades, the Winter Garden of Maison Proust, the Maison's second salon, offers a subtly elegant setting. You can play backgammon, chess or dominoes, read a book from the neighboring library or simply daydream in front of the marvelous paintings, witnesses to the Proustian era illustrated by Belle Époque elegants and dandies. Casting their old-fashioned shadows on the luxurious Cordoba leather wall panels and the ceiling's gold-woven velum, the elaborate fringed lighting fixtures also contribute to the place's charming ambience.

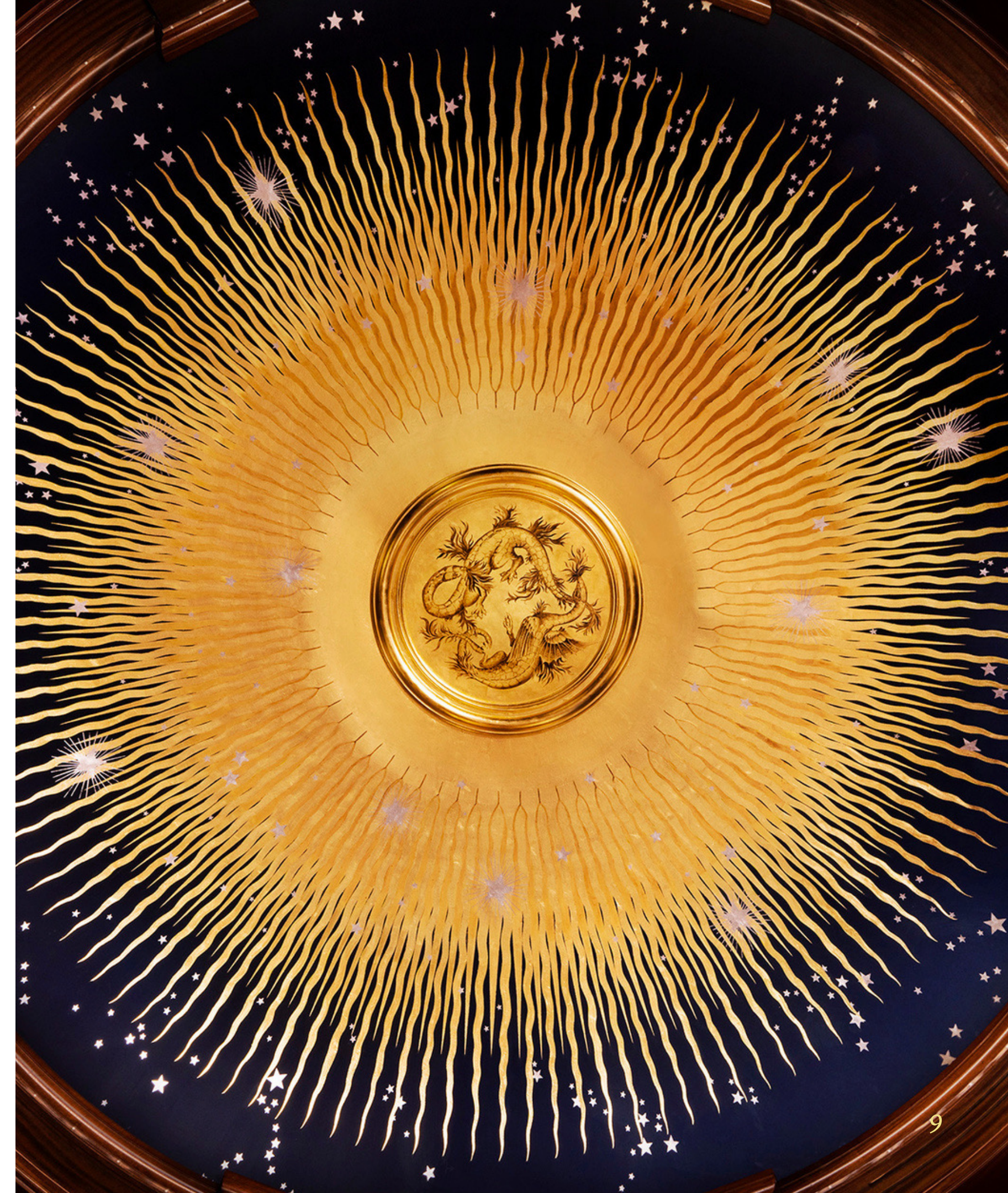


• The Library •

The architectural jewel of the salons, the Rotunda Library features hundreds of books evoking the world of Marcel Proust, including a rare handwritten letter and an original edition by the author. A marvellous work of art, its ceiling - executed in gold leaf and embellished with stars - echoes that of the Rotonde du Soleil at the Opéra Garnier, one of the favourite party venues of the Parisian aristocracy during the Belle Époque.

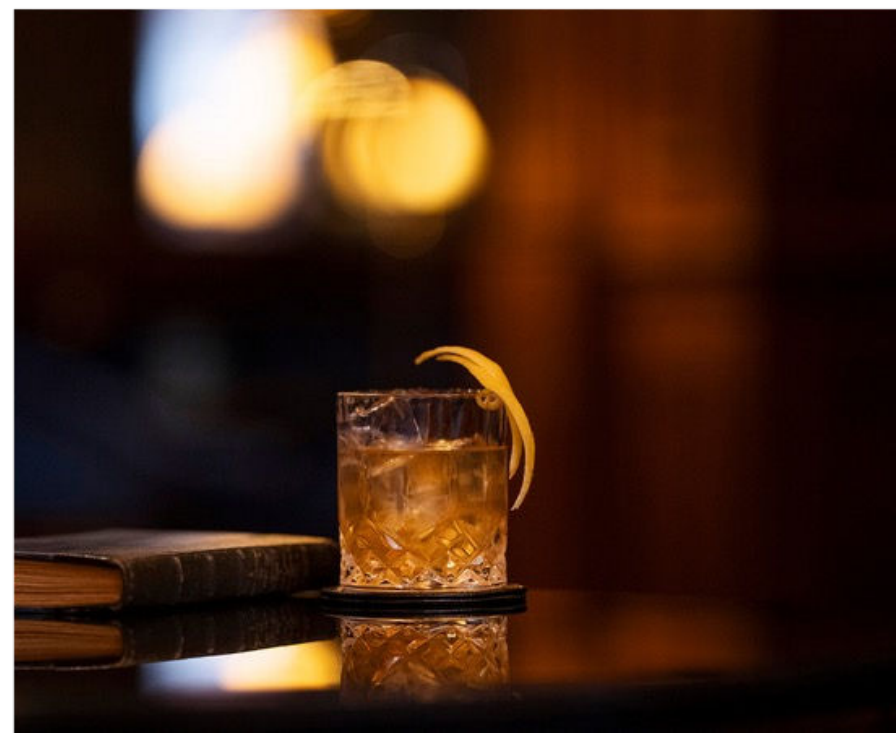
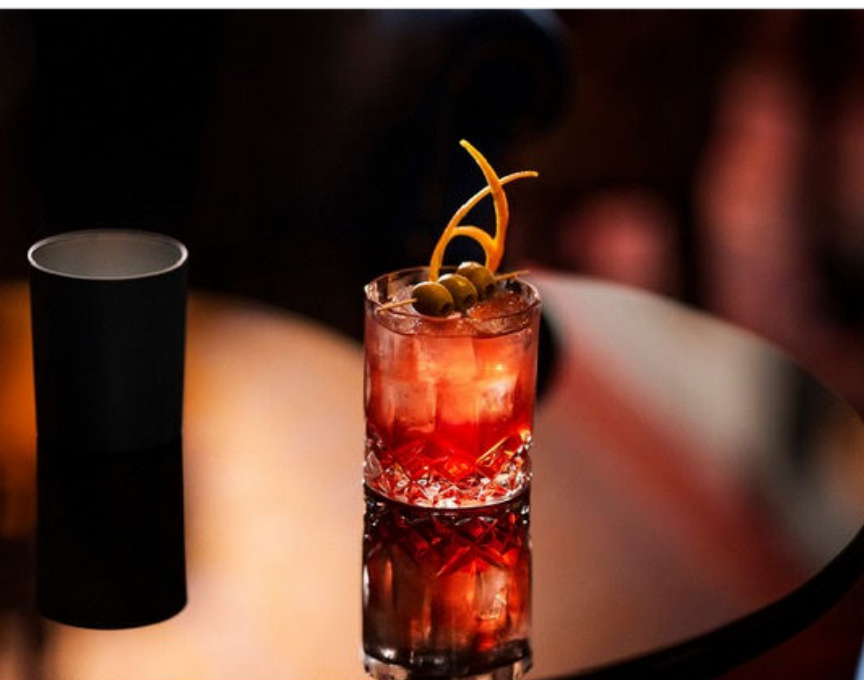
